## s A Home for Maiya

"What started with a freak accident led to a life-changing diagnosis for our 22-month-old daughter.

"In December 2019, Maiya had a couple of falls over a three-week period—one that ultimately left her with a fractured ankle. While at the ER, doctors noticed some of her levels were abnormal. We followed up with our family physician, who prescribed some supplements to remedy her blood counts.

"Over the next month, Maiya developed concerning symptoms that only seemed to worsen as time went on. She was irritable, pale, had no energy, and slept a lot. She had a decreased appetite, bruises in abnormal spots, and lost the ability to walk again after her fracture had healed. We just knew something serious was happening so we took her to get her blood rechecked.

"We got a phone call from the head physician at our doctor's office the following day telling us to go back to the ER immediately because Maiya's blood counts were abnormal. On February 11th, we were told our daughter was extremely sick, but because our local hospital was not equipped for her care, we needed to take her to HSC Children's Hospital in Winnipeg

where they could further evaluate her.

"On February 13th, we got the official diagnosis— Maiya has B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia, a type of blood cancer. At 22-months-old, our precious little girl was now in the fight for her life. We spent twelve days on the oncology ward where Maiya was given multiple transfusions and started on her chemotherapy treatment.

"We used the Ronald McDonald Family Room during our stay at HSC Children's Hospital. The meals we received, the baked goods, laundry service, and hot coffee that is always available were so appreciated during those long days and nights in the hospital. The common area provided a refuge, a place to relax away from the overwhelming hospital room. I don't think I'll ever forget our first meal prepared by the volunteers—lasagna—especially since it was Valentine's Day.

"As our discharge date got closer, we began to get nervous about where we were going to stay. Being from the Westman area, we needed a place that was close to CancerCare Manitoba, in Winnipeg, where Maiya would be continuing her treatments. The social worker told us about Ronald McDonald House and sent the referral for our stay. We were extremely relieved when Ronald McDonald House staff called saying they had a room available for us.

"We quickly became comfortable living at the House. While it was a new living situation and we had a very sick toddler, we were able to establish a routine. We got to know some of the other families living there, sharing the volunteer-prepared meals together and sharing our own homemade meals. We enjoyed communal gatherings, often with extended family members visiting,


"That is, until COVID-19 turned the world upside down. We appreciate all the new protocols RMHC Manitoba put into place during the pandemic. It was a unique situation we all had to navigate together. With every new change, we always knew it was to help keep us safe.

"We developed a special relationship with the staff at the House during our stay, mostly because at the time the pandemic hit, Maiya was the only child at the House full-time. We celebrated spring and her second birthday while living at the House, and the staff did everything they could to make it special for her.

"We remained feeling comfortable, safe, and secure in the House for a total of 68 days, when Maiya reached a point in her treatment that didn't require us to be so close to CancerCare Manitoba. She is doing extremely well, having only a few side effects of treatment. It's hard to believe she is still fighting this disease, and will be until May of 2022. We will be staying at the House regularly until the end of Maiya's treatment, as she has many back-to-back appointments requiring an overnight stay.

"While the pandemic may have changed the overall running of the House, it still feels like home. It's a home we will continue to go to when needed. It's a home we will encourage anyone to use who needs it. It's a home we will forever be grateful for."

As families travelled to Winnipeg to receive the care and treatment their children needed, RMHC Manitoba was here for families. Proudly providing all essential needs, a total of 3,827 nights of accommodation were provided across both core programs (Ronald McDonald House and Ronald McDonald Family Room). Families saved over \$830,000 in out-of-pocket expenses, and found safe havens of care and compassion where and when they needed it most.

The RMHC Manitoba mission exists for one reason—to keep families together. Together is made possible through the caring and steadfast generosity of our donors and partners. As the trying times of 2020 continued to present continuous change and challenges, one constant remained—the kind support from the incredible network of RMHC Manitoba donors. Having donors by our side, with such generosity and kindness, meant RMHC Manitoba was a constant support for families. It's truly a beautiful circle of care and compassion. We share endless gratitude and appreciation to all those who continue to make the RMHC Manitoba mission possible.

When the pandemic struck the world, RMHC Manitoba was well into its capital campaign to build a new Ronald McDonald House. Board, Capital Campaign Cabinet, and organizational leadership carefully discussed the next steps. Fueled by the urgent need of families, and the current capacity/design of the existing House, the team moved forward. Amid professional and personal commitments, an incredible team of volunteer leadership deepened their commitment to push forward for families, and push forward they did. Across fundraising, construction, communication, and finance committees, an aligned commitment was affirmed resulting in invaluable contributions. By the end of 2020, RMHC Manitoba awarded tender, fundraising was extremely strong, communication campaigns were underway, and financial planning was in place. RMHC Manitoba was positioned to break ground on the new House in the early spring of 2021. Our immense thanks and appreciation goes to the RMHC Manitoba Board and capital campaign leadership team for their time, talents, expertise, and shared passion to make the new House a reality.

It is during challenging times that we often witness the deepest strength and resiliency of teams. This was certainly so for team RMHC Manitoba. The depth and breadth of the staff and volunteer team answered the increased call to serve families. Staff pivoted, adapted, and displayed incredible resiliency as they planned, prepared, and delivered the RMHC Manitoba mission throughout the pandemic. Volunteers shifted and adapted to support the chapter in new and creative ways. Inspired by the courage and love of the families, the team stepped up, leaned into the depth of the RMHC global system, and faced challenges with perseverance to ensure families were cared for and supported. Our endless appreciation and gratitude goes out to every member of the RMHC Manitoba team. Their hard work, Grateful dedication, commitment, and compassion is recognized and celebrated.

As we look to 2021, we do so with our hearts overflowing with gratitude and souls filled with inspiration. #### RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE®

RMHC Manitoba's Ronald McDonald House has been a beacon of hope for families with sick or injured children since 1984.

Eligible families from rural Manitoba or out-of-province residents, who live outside the city perimeter from HSC Children's Hospital, HSC Women's Hospital, or St. Boniface hospital, are referred to stay at the House by hospital staff.

The 11,000 square foot space is situated a short walk from Health Sciences Centre and supports up to 14 families at a time. Proudly serving families from HSC Children's Hospital, Women's Hospital, St. Boniface Hospital, and other pediatric health care centres.

Access to RMHC Manitoba saves families from travelling repeated long distances for the care their children need. It also alleviates financial burdens associated with their medical journey, receive support and essential resources, and most importantly, stay close to their sick children.

#### RONALD MCDONALD FAMILY ROOM®

Situated on the third floor of HSC Children's Hospital since 2010, the Family Room celebrated its 10 year anniversary last year. The 3,500 square foot space offers a home-like environment for families with children receiving medical treatment so they can relax and recharge together. The space is a comfortable haven within the hospital with three on-site sleeping rooms, napping lounge, full kitchen, laundry facilities, showers, and living room, only steps away from their sick child's bedside.

The Family Room is available for all families with children who are pediatric, neonatal, or emergency patients who reside in Winnipeg, rural Manitoba, or out-of-province. Sleeping rooms are also available to families who require the most urgent care.


#### Fries for Good & Round Up for RMHC

## Our Financials

For many, 2020 is a year to forget, but for RMHC Manitoba, 2020 is a year to remember. With the help from our generous donors, various partnerships, and our tireless RMHC team members/volunteers, we not only achieved our mission to assist families in need, but also finished the year with a stronger financial position. This enables us to better serve the families and take the organization to the next chapter.

2020 was a challenging year. RMHC Manitoba continued to serve our mission by offering a "home-away-from home". This year, our signature events, the Hope Couture Fashion Gala and FORE! THE HOUSE Tournament of Champions Golf Tournament, transformed into virtual or socially-distanced style events. During the year, the organization carried out a significant capital campaign for the construction of the new House.


Combining innovative fundraising ideas with the overwhelming support we received from the capital campaign, the revenue finished at \$4,010,437, which represents a 27% increase over the prior year. Of this amount, \$1,751,746 of the revenue represents funds raised for our new House build. Expenses decreased over the previous year by 17%, mainly due to careful spending management. The total of the cash equivalents (cash and short-term investment) at the end of year 2020 was \$3,635,158, which represents a 111% increase over the previous year.

The successful 2020 wouldn't have been possible without the continued support of our generous donors, corporate sponsors, and volunteers. Thank you for your heartwarming kindness and giving. We look forward to continuing to work with the community and all stakeholders to provide a safe and caring environment for the families and children who need it the most.



## - Threads of Hope

"On February 23, 2018, our entire world changed. Dustin and I arrived in Winnipeg from Kenora for a pediatrician appointment and scheduled MRI. We had an overnight bag and absolutely no premonition of the nightmare that was to come. There are no words to describe the numbness and fear of uncertainty we felt at the time.

"A referral made by the nurse led to a call. I answered the phone and the voice on the other end said, 'Hi, Lynda. My name's Pat and I'm from Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) Manitoba. We have a room available. Why don't you come by? I'll show you around.' While Dustin was a patient at HSC Children's Hospital, two blocks away was a comfortable bed, a warm shower, a home-cooked meal and a true sense you are not alone. Colby, my eldest son, and I could take turns switching off between hospital and rest.

"Eventually, Dustin was given day passes and instead of a hotel room, we had a home. It was a place away from the hospital and a place of peace and normalcy surrounded by compassion and care.

"We have travelled to Winnipeg no less than 40 times. Each time, a phone call to welcoming hearts, whenever we needed a home, awaited us.

"The staff welcomes and supports the families. They do everything they can to ease the burden of all the little things, while we tend to the big things.

"All I can say about the volunteers is, 'wow'! We felt privileged to get to know them and their reasons for volunteering. One of the many incredible volunteers we crossed paths with was an RMHC Manitoba volunteer who had been volunteering since 1985. He explained to us, 'I lost my daughter to cancer when she was eight-years-old. Her spirit lives on in me while I do these little things.' He showed he cared and reassured Dustin about the gifts of modern medicine.

"The families at RMHC Manitoba have their own unique stories and yet, are bound together by one common thread, a sick child. We shared stories, laughed, cried, and reassured each other that we are together and we are home.
